Parking Policy and Vehicle Registration What You Need to Know

Attention Pages Place residents! Have you reviewed the email regarding the updated, revised parking layout and parking policies? If not, don't worry. You can access both documents on the Pages Place website under "Upcoming Neighborhood Changes."

These changes are crucial for all community members, as they affect parking rules and enforcement. To avoid penalties, please familiarize yourself with the updated layout and policies. Notable adjustments include the following:

- **No Warnings:** Effective June 1, 2025, violations such as parking without a permit or using an incorrect permit will no longer receive warning notices.
- Parking Restrictions: Parking outside of designated areas will result in penalties for you and your household members.

We encourage all residents to review these updates carefully to ensure compliance and avoid any inconvenience.

Vehicle Registration Update

As of April 27, 2025, 14 homes have not updated their vehicle information in the registration system. Additionally, some household have incomplete submissions, leaving fields such as vehicle year, make, current parking permit number, or associated unit number blank. Please note that all fields are required for successful registration.

To keep your vehicle records up-to-date, you can easily register, update, or delete vehicle information through the vehicle registration system. This platform also allows you to submit visitor parking requests. Any changes made will automatically notify the HOA via email upon submission.

IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR RESIDENTS: UPCOMING ROAD WORK

Attention Homeowners and Landlords:

We are giving you early notice regarding scheduled maintenance on our private road. Please review the details and share this information with all household members and tenants to ensure everyone is prepared.

Road Closure Details

- Monday, May 12, 2025: The road will be closed from 6:00 AM to 3:00 PM for crack seal repairs.
- Tuesday, May 13, 2025, to Wednesday, May 14, 2025: The road will be shut down from 6:00 AM on May 13 until 3:00 PM on May 14 for road sealing and restriping.

The affected area extends from Pages Lane to the property line between Pages Place and Call Meadows. During this time, residents must park along Pages Lane, 200 West, or other suitable locations.

IMPORTANT NOTICE: Failure to comply with these closures, which damages the newly resurfaced road, will result in the respective homeowner or landlord being responsible for repairs.

The HOA Board will notify the community if there are any updates or changes to this schedule. If you have questions or concerns, please reach out to the Pages Place email.
